- b. 8 parking spaces to be set aside for Care Giver parking

Motion was made by Councilman Westcott, seconded by Councilman DeThomas, and carried unanimously to approve the site plan application of Coen Oil Group for the consolidation of seven lots and the construction and expansion of the current commercial use located at 1330 Jefferson Ave, Washington, PA.

Motion was made by Councilman Westcott, seconded by Councilman DeThomas, and carried unanimously to authorize the proper City Officials to take all necessary action to acquire the vacant property located on Mill Street Washington, PA. (Tax Parcel No. 710-008-00-00-0001-00)

COMMENT: Councilman Westcott stated that the parcel is being donated to the City. He said that it is in the area where the Wheeling Street Project will be done.
